

## Travel information

### Meeting venue:

#### **Biomedicum, Karolinska Institutet, Solnavägen 9, 171 65 Solna.**

The ENIC-NARIC joint meeting will be held at Biomedicum, a research building at the renowned Karolinska Institute, located just outside the Stockholm city limit. Built in 2018 this state-of-the-art-facilities offers the ideal location for our meeting.



### How to get here:

The Biomedicum is located approximately a forty minute walk from the inner City. It is serviced by several bus routes, as well as the metro.

Bus routes: Bus 3, 6, 67, 73 and 77 will take you to Biomedicum. The bus stop is located just outside the building and is called "Karolinska Sjukhuset Eugeniavägen" or "Karolinska Institutet Biomedicum" depending on the bus.

Metro: The metro stations in Stockholm are marked T (from the Swedish word tunnelbana). The closest metro station is S:t Eriksplan. From there it is about a 10 minute walk to Biomedicum.

### Hotels

#### **Reception, Sunday evening, June 11th**

Welcome to the magical fairy tale world of Astrid Lindgren, the author of Pippi Longstocking among others. We will start by taking the Story Train where we will meet some of the characters in Swedish children's books. It will be followed by a reception, including drinks and fingerfoods.

## **The Vasa Museum, Galärvarvsvägen 14, Stockholm**

### **Dinner, Monday evening, June 12th**

The Vasa is the best-preserved seventeenth-century ship in the world and a unique art treasure. Almost all of the ship is original, and it is decorated with hundreds of carved sculptures. The 69 meter-long warship Vasa sank on its maiden voyage in Stockholm harbor in 1628 and was salvaged 333 years later in 1961.

We will start with a tour of the museum followed by a three-course dinner. Warm clothes are essential as the Vasa Museum only holds a temperature of 18 degrees Celsius. The stonefloor is also uneven, appropriate shoes are recommended.

Junibacken and the Vasa Museum are located next to each other.

#### **How to get here:**

From bus stop Karolinska Institutet/Biomedicum:

By Bus: Bus 72 towards Frihamnen or bus 6 towards Ropsten, get off at bus stop Odenplan, change to Bus 67 towards Blockhusudden. Get off at Nordiska muséet/Vasamuséet (dep every 15 minutes). About 45 minutes travel.

By Metro: A 15-minute walk to station S:t Eriksplan, take the green line to T-Centralen, change to red line to station Karlaplan (15 minutes) and a 10 minute walk or take bus 67 towards Blockhusudden. Get off at Nordiska muséet/Vasamuséet.

From the city center bus stop/station T-Centralen/Sergels torg:

By Bus: Bus 69 towards Djurgårdsbrunn/ Tram 7 towards Djurgården Waldemarsudde, get off at Djurgårdsbron. About 10 minutes travel.

By Metro: Red line to station Karlaplan (towards Ropsten) and a 10-minute walk or bus 67 towards Blockhusudden to bus stop Nordiska museet/Vasamuseet.

Commuter Ferry: You may also take the Djurgården ferry from Nybroplan/Nybrokajen (ferry number 80) or Slussen (ferry number 82). It is run by SL and you buy the ticket the same way as for other public transportation. The ferry takes only a 12 minutes and you get off at the first stop, Allmänna Gränd. From there it is a 10 minute walk to the Vasa Museum and Junibacken.

#### **Travel app**

Stockholm is a very pedestrian friendly city. However, the distances between our points of activities are quite far apart. In order to plan your trip as well as purchasing tickets is helpful to download a travel app. You may also use a contactless card or mobile device to buy tickets. If you go by Metro you scan the ticket on the automatic barriers, if you go by bus or tram there is a card reader. You have several options of tickets; single journey, 24 hour or 72 hour tickets, depending on your needs.

#### **From Arlanda Airport to Stockholm City Center**

**The Arlanda express train** provides a shuttle service between Stockholm Arlanda Airport and Stockholm Central Station. The platform is easily accessible underneath the arrival terminals.

The trains depart every 10 minutes in rush hour traffic, and every 15 minutes at other times. Travel time: 18 minutes. Tickets cost 320 SEK single journey and 600 SEK round trip.

Coaches, **Flygbussarna**, depart from outside the arrival terminal 4 (and 5) every 10-20 minutes. Travel time ca. 45 minutes. Tickets cost 129 SEK single journey and 209 SEK round trip if booked online. <https://www.flygbussarna.se>

Taxi is also available outside the terminals 2 and 5. Please check that you travel with a registered taxi company. Travel time ca. 40 minutes. Prices range between 450-550 SEK. <https://www.swedavia.com/arlanda/taxi/>
