

# Foreign qualification assessment

The extract indicates what a foreign qualification is comparable to in the Swedish qualification system. The information can be used when applying for a job or planning for further studies. Decisions regarding employment, admission or formal professional recognition are made by the employer, education provider or competent authority.

## About the qualification comparison

UHR assesses the foreign qualification as comparable to a vocational qualification at upper secondary level in Sweden. The qualification prepares for work in a specific occupation.

The foreign qualification does not give access to higher education in Sweden. For information about other ways of meeting the higher education entry requirements, please see Studera.nu.

The qualification is placed at a level in the awarding country that corresponds to level 3 in the Swedish National Qualifications (SeQF) – see the figure below. There are currently no Swedish qualifications at SeQF 3.

This assessment is provided as guidance by UHR. It is based on our knowledge of the country's education system and not on the individual's education documents. UHR applies the principles of the international recognition convention Lisbon Recognition Convention and assumes the foreign qualification is recognised in the country of study.

<b>Duration</b>	6 years  The qualification is based on 6 years of schooling.
<b>Information about the qualification</b>	The qualification prepares for work in a specific occupational field.

<b>Country information</b>	There are three different education systems in Belgium: the Flemish Community (Dutch language), the French Community (Wallonia, French language) and the German speaking Community in the east. Each region has its own qualifications framework.

## The level of Swedish qualifications and degrees

Swedish degrees and final grades are placed within reference frameworks that show different levels of learning outcomes. In the figure, the Swedish reference framework SeQF is shown as well as the European reference frameworks that facilitate comparison to other countries. Please note the figure does not contain all Swedish qualifications.
