



**Techne** 

Knowledge surrounding making and changing things — technical knowledge and craft

Knowledge about wise actions and ethics – the ability to combine values and knowledge to make judgements.

# What were the goals of education in Bologna University, in 1088?

Bologna University is usually referred to as the first modern university

It was the first university to have a system of academic degrees and to provide a structured curriculum. It also employed a body of professors who were responsible for teaching and conducting research, and it fostered a spirit of intellectual freedom and scholarly inquiry.

# What were the goals of education at Uppsala University in 1477?

- Theological Education
- Classical Studies: Latin and Greek languages, literature, and philosophy
- Legal Education primarily influenced by Roman law principles
- Philosophical Education
- Rhetoric and Oratory Skills

The university aimed to provide a comprehensive education that prepared students for religious, intellectual, and administrative roles in society,

# What were the goals of education at Humboldt University, Berlin in 1810?

The educational goal of Humboldt University in 1810 was to establish a model of higher education that integrated teaching and research, promoted intellectual freedom and critical thinking, and emphasized a broad and liberal education aimed at personal and intellectual growth.














The World Values Survey is the world's largest ongoing study of people's values. It has been carried out by researchers in many countries since 1981.










#### The Inglehart-Welzel World Cultural Map 2023

#### I. Autonomy

Do you want your child to develop to become independent and creative or do you want to prioritize discipline and obedience?

#### II. Equality

Should men have priority for jobs, university education and political leadership over women?

#### III. Make your own decisions - choice


Does the individual have the right to decide for himself whether: homosexuality, abortion, divorce?

#### IV. To make one's voice heard – voice

Economic growth and strong defense — or freedom to influence one's workplace, local community and government




### Democracy's dependence on emancipatory values








# Level of Education among non-European migrants, Sweden




# Level of Education among non-European in SFI (Swedish for Foreigners) The county of Sörmland & the town of Eskilstuna





# General trust based on educational level






### Emancipatory values after 1989
